

Meeting to celebrate the centennial of R.A. Fisher's famous 1918 Paper on the theory of quantitative trait inheritance:

100 years of quantitative genetics theory and its applications: celebrating the centenary of Fisher 1918

The meeting will take place on Tuesday October 9, 2018, at the Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh (<https://www.rcsed.ac.uk/>). This is in a central location within walking distance of the main rail station and the airport bus and tram stops. It also has its own hotel adjacent to the conference centre. The meeting is sponsored by the Fisher Memorial Trust, the Genetics Society, the Galton Institute, the London Mathematical Society and the Royal Statistical Society.

There will be 8 invited speakers, with the Fisher Memorial Lecture at 5pm, followed by a reception.

In addition, 4 early career speakers and up to 30 posters will be selected from submitted abstracts by the organising committee (Kay Boulton, Brian Charlesworth, Bill Hill and Sylvia Richardson).
